In 2015, Mattie Miracle launched its first Snack & Item Cart at MedStar Georgetown University Hospital in Washington, DC. When caring for Mattie in the hospital, the Co-Founders of Mattie Miracle learned first hand, **the importance of outside support and generosity**. The Brown Family's support community provided food, snacks, and drinks daily for 14 months. These gifts were vital to maintaining their basic needs and enabled them to care for Mattie by his bedside.

The Snack & Item Carts were designed to provide this same level of support, but on a grander scale, to countless families caring for children with cancer and other life threatening illnesses. **Mattie Miracle operates five Carts**: two at MedStar Georgetown University Hospital (Washington, DC), two at Children's Hospital at Sinai (Baltimore, MD), and one at NIH's Clinical Center (Bethesda, MD).

Our Carts meet the needs of over **2,500 families a year**, and provide nutritional snacks, candy, toiletries, drinks, and wellness items free of charge to families. Each Fall, Mattie Miracle hosts a **virtual community Item Drive**. The candy and snacks supporters donate enable us to keep our Carts stocked.

It's Not Just About the Medicine.....


 The <u>Psychosocial Standards of Care</u> provide evidence-based information on the emotional and social support needs to optimize the quality of life for children with cancer and their families (Wiener et al., 2015).

- Optimal cancer treatment must include psychosocial care (Institute of Medicine, 2008).
- 3. Depression and other psychosocial concerns can affect **adherence to treatment** (Institute of Medicine, 2008).
- 4. Psychosocial care has been shown to yield better management of pain and fatigue (Jacobsen et al., 2012).
- Treating the pain, symptoms, and stress of cancer enhances quality of life and is as important as treating the disease (Institute of Medicine, 2015).
- Siblings of children with cancer are at risk for developing anxiety, depression, and posttraumatic stress disorder (Alderfer et al., 2003).
- 7. Childhood cancer survivors reported medication use for **anxiety and depression** at rates nearly two times those reported by the general public (Hawkins et al., 2017).
- 8. Symptoms of **post-traumatic stress** disorder are well documented for parents whose children have completed cancer treatment (Kazak et al., 2004).
- Financial hardship during childhood cancer treatment negatively impacts family well-being (Bona et al., 2014).
- The death of a child to cancer frequently results in depression, anxiety, loss of appetite, sleep disturbances, and fatigue (Alam et al., 2012).



Impacting Care

Mattie Miracle has been funding Child Life services since 2011. Child Life Specialists play a critical role in supporting child health and wellness. They provide preparation, education, distraction, play, and coping tools. In the process they minimize stress, anxiety, and psychosocial trauma, while empowering children and families.

In the last six months (January to June 2024), **Emily Nosek** (our child life specialist at Children's Hospital at Sinai) has supported **636 children** through various procedures such as IV placement and port access. Thanks to Emily's interventions and support, she has helped **95% of her patients** successfully cope and manage these

procedures.

Mattie Miracle is honored to support the amazing work of Child Life Specialists, and to directly meet the psychosocial needs of children with cancer and their families.



M&M Wishes

In 2021, Mattie Miracle launched its M&M (Margy & Mattie) Wishes Program in memory of our board member, Margy Jost. M&M Wishes offers families a grant of up to \$1,000 to support a fun activity, trip, or a wish list item for a child or teen with cancer.

To date, Mattie Miracle has granted \$34,000 worth of M&M Wishes to children and their families. Mattie Miracle understands that wishes must be granted around a family's timing and needs, and we work hard to ensure that children and teens have a chance at making their dreams come true.

Therapy Grants

Our therapy support program grants children with cancer up to \$1,000 for therapy sessions with a licensed mental health provider within their community. Families face a host of mental health issues as a result of a childhood cancer diagnosis, such as depression, anxiety, medical traumatic stress, substance abuse, and eating disorders. Yet frequently families of children with cancer are referred out of the hospital system and into the community for support, in order for them to manage and cope with their psychosocial needs and concerns.

The problem with this is it is very challenging for families to access such support because of financial difficulties. To date, Mattie Miracle has awarded \$12,000 of therapy support to children and teens with cancer. We invite families and their social workers to reach out to us about our Therapy Support Grants.
